Worimi Elder

Aunty Janice is a valued Worimi community member, having spent most of her life living in Forster.

Aunty Janice is co-founder of the Baraya Wakulda Choir, singing together in Gathang the language of Janice's people Woromi. The Choir was borne out of the Big Sing in the Desert, Alice Springs, followed by the Big Sing by the Sea, Forster. As Aunty Janice says, *'Singing brings people together'*.

Indigenous Knowledge belongs to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people, communities and organisations or businesses. Indigenous Knowledge can reflect and identify a community's history, cultural and social identity, and values.

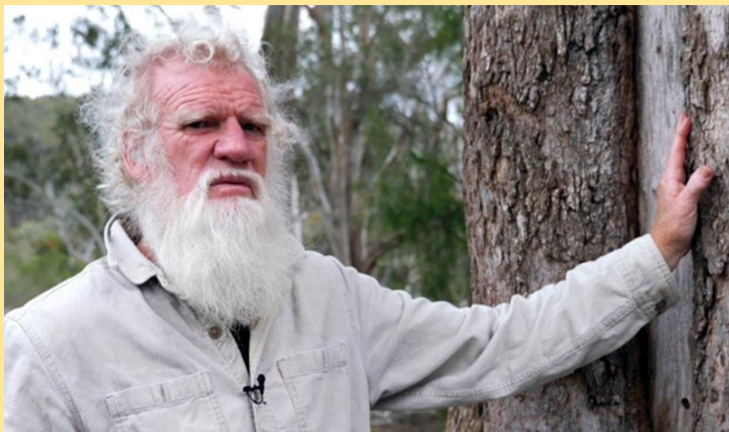

Bill wrote *The Broken Years* (1974) on the First AIF, *Narrandera Shire* (1988), *The Sky Travellers: Journeys in New Guinea 1938-9* (1998), *The Biggest Estate on Earth* (2011) and with Bruce Pascoe, *Country: Future Fire, Future Farming* (2021).



Bruce Pascoe is a Yuin, Bunurong and Tasmanian man born in the Melbourne suburb of Richmond.

Bruce is a writer and a farmer growing Australian Aboriginal Grains and tubers. He is the author of the best-selling *Dark Emu*, *Young Dark Emu*; and over thirty other books including the short story collections *Night Animals* and *Nightjar*.
